

Reviewing **Indo- Pak** Bilateral Relations

Quarterly Monitoring Brief

April 2018 - June 2018

India and Pakistan seemed to be making progress in their bilateral relations as tensions abated at the end of March when both countries released a coordinated statement reiterating their decision to adhere to the 1992 code of conduct for diplomatic staff. This positive turn in relations was short-lived, and from April to June 2018, bilateral relations once again entered a phase of *détente*. The quarter was punctuated by a few positive statements and decisions, resulting in nothing more than a few temporary moments of respite.

The Kishanganga project, subject to immense criticism from Pakistan for nearly a decade, was finally inaugurated by India in late May this year. Pakistan termed the construction of the hydropower project a violation of the Indus Water Treaty (IWT), and approached the World Bank to address their concerns however the involved parties could not reach a resolution. While Pakistan lodged several protests with India, the latter did not accept allegations of violating the IWT.

Ceasefire violations and unrelenting violence in Kashmir continued and worsened in this quarter resulting in increased casualties. The gang rape of an eight year old girl by many men including an Indian police constable sparked protests and fears of communal violence and growing insecurity among the Muslim community in Hindu majority areas of Indian Occupied Kashmir. 17 people were also killed by Indian forces as they clashed with protestors. Pakistani PM Shahid Khaqan Abbasi called the killings deplorable. In the beginning of June, Indian security personnel drove an armored vehicle into a crowd of protestors in Srinagar, killing one person. Increased state violence further exacerbated already strained bilateral relations.

Pakistan summoned the Indian Deputy High Commissioner and other senior diplomats several times over the quarter to condemn ceasefire violations. Pakistan's DGMO also took up the matter of ceasefire violations with his Indian counterpart, and at the end of May, in what was an unprecedented move, the DGMOs of both countries released identical statements agreeing to restore ceasefire along the LoC and Working Border. This agreement however was short-lived as only three days later Indian troops shot and killed a man in Azad Jammu Kashmir, bringing an abrupt end to the DGMOs' agreement. As the quarter progressed, violence in Kashmir and ceasefire violations continued to rise.

While they were not as incendiary or as frequent as in the first quarter of the year, several aggressive remarks were made during this period. Indian Home Minister, Rajnath Singh, accused Pakistan of attempting to break India up by aiding militant entry into India. In May, Indian Defence Minister, Nirmala Sitharaman, said that India would treat any comments by Pakistan on wanting peace seriously, but in June, he said that while India would make an effort to honor the ceasefire agreement, if provoked, the Indian Army would not hold back from giving Pakistan a fitting response. Also in June, Singh and the Indian External Affairs Minister, Sushma Swaraj expressed India's willingness to engage in dialogue only if Pakistan eradicated terrorism.

Barring a few, statements from the Pakistani side centered on the importance of dialogue for normalizing bilateral relation. Speaking at the Pakistan Military Academy, Pakistan COAS Qamar Javed Bajwa said that resolution of disputes between the two countries was possible only through comprehensive and meaningful dialogue. Pakistan's NSA Nasser Janjua also stressed on the importance of dialogue over war for the resolution of disputes and path to peace.

In a first, Pakistan and India announced their decision to participate in a joint military exercise in Russia under the banner of the Shanghai Cooperation Organization (SCO). Additionally, an anti-terrorism conference was organised in Islamabad under the SCO that India agreed to attend.

Despite the temporary relief brought on by a few positive developments, tensions between the two countries did not show any signs of abating as the quarter came to an end. In late June, strains in Pakistan and India's relations led the two countries to refrain from exchanging sweets at Wagah Border on Eid, defying a long-held tradition. Pakistan's High Commissioner to India Sohail Mahmood was also not invited for the Eid celebration hosted by External Affairs Minister Sushma Swaraj.
