

Reviewing **Indo- Pak** Bilateral Relations

Quarterly Monitoring Brief

October 2018 - December 2018

Hostile statements from India and Pakistan continued in the last quarter of 2018 as ceasefire violations continued at the Line of Control and bilateral relations remained tense. Perhaps the most significant development under the new government of Prime Minister Imran Khan was the offer of opening the Kartarpur corridor for Sikh pilgrims.

The quarter began with a controversy about Azad Jammu and Kashmir's Prime Minister, Raja Farooq Haider's helicopter and whether it strayed over the Line of Control. The Indians claimed that it did, and consequently the Indian Army reportedly fired at the helicopter. Pakistan rejected these claims, passing a unanimous resolution in the National Assembly condemning the attack on a civilian helicopter.

India's Union Home Minister and Army Chief continued to release belligerent statements threatening another surgical strike across the Line of Control. Pakistan's DG ISPR said that Pakistan will respond to a single surgical strike from the Indian side with one of its own. Warmongering between the two sides continued as Home Minister Rajnath Singh performed a "worship of weapons" at the Indo-Pak border, an unprecedented move by any Union Minister or senior member of the government. The Indian Army Chief Bipin Rawat also made a statement calling for the secularization of Pakistan after which India would consider dialogue. Pakistan's Foreign Minister rejected such an idea, and said that Pakistan would remain an Islamic state. The Foreign Office also rejected India's allegations of border infiltration and sponsoring terrorism as propaganda.

In the tense atmosphere in which bilateral relations between India and Pakistan were folding this quarter, respite was offered by the ground-breaking of the much awaited Kartarpur corridor. Speaking to journalists after the ceremony, Foreign Minister Qureshi said that Pakistan wants good relations with India, and peace in the region. A few days prior to the groundbreaking ceremony, Pakistan also issued 3,800 visas to Sikh pilgrims for Guru Prav, and announced its decision to invite Modi to the SAARC summit. In what spelled an end to the very brief good-will brought about by Kartarpur, Modi rejected Pakistan's invitation for the SAARC summit in keeping with its earlier strategy of blocking the SAARC. Pakistan also released a statement soon after, denouncing Indian claims that alleged Pakistan of having ulterior motives for opening the Kartarpur corridor.

Ceasefire violations from both sides continued throughout the quarter, with civilian and military casualties on both sides. A teenage boy, a woman and five other civilians were killed in Indian shelling at the LoC. Military casualties from both sides were also reported. DGMO hot line discussions were held to discuss the situation at the Indo-Pak border. India also called the Pakistani High Commissioner to lodge protest against continuous ceasefire violations. Pakistan did the same.

Atrocities in Indian Occupied Kashmir intensified this quarter. In October, three Kashmiri freedom fighters and six others were killed when an explosion took place in a crowd protesting Indian rule in Kulgam. In December, there was a shutdown in Kashmir as India arrested pro-freedom leaders. Fourteen protestors were also killed and two-hundred injured as Indian forces clamped down on anti-India protests. At the end of December, four boys were killed in a cordon and search operation in Indian Occupied Kashmir; thousands attended their funeral.

Pakistan approached multiple international platforms regarding violence in Kashmir and to gain support for its stance on Kashmir. Mushahid Hussain discussed the atrocities being committed in Indian Occupied Kashmir with the EU, and Maleeha Lodhi spoke on the topic at multiple UN forums. Imran Khan raised the Kashmir issue with UN Chief, Antonio Guterres. Shireen Mazari said that Pakistan fully supports the freedom movement of people from Indian occupied Kashmir. Responding to Indian allegations of offering monetary support to the freedom movement in Kashmir, the DG ISPR said that Pakistan is offering the people of Indian Occupied Kashmir moral and diplomatic support only.

During this quarter, the International Court of Justice announced that it will hear arguments regarding the Indian spy

Kulbhushan Jhadav's case in early 2019. Pakistan also returned a man who entered Pakistan on the pretext of meeting a lover but suspected of being a spy back to India. India similarly returned a Pakistani man who claimed to have similar motives for entering the country.

Pakistan also asked India to share Kishanganga water data, and Pakistan's Commissioner on the Permanent Indus Water Commission, Syed Mehr Ali Shah said that it might launch an aggressive campaign against India over IWT violations, especially because India was not arranging an inspection visit for Pakistan. By the end of the quarter, not much progress had been made in reaching a consensus on the Kishanganga water conflict.
